



NOVA Content Strategy & Communications Intern 2026 - 2027

The National Organization for Victim Advocacy (NOVA) has been a recognized leader in the victims' rights movement since 1975, advocating for the advancement and enforcement of victims' rights, championing dignity and compassion for survivors of crime, and promoting the professionalization of victim advocacy.

Serving under the Policy and Inclusive Communications Program Manager, the NOVA Content Strategy & Communications Intern will support national efforts to strengthen survivor-centered communications, public education, advocacy campaigns, and digital engagement related to victim services and victims' rights.

This position is content creation heavy and primarily focused on policy and advocacy communications. Ideal candidates will have an interest in digital communications, storytelling, public education, and nonprofit communications strategy. Responsibilities include developing graphics and short-form content; editing video and visual materials; supporting social media and campaign coordination; monitoring trends and engagement opportunities; and translating policy topics into accessible, engaging public-facing content. The intern may also support communications across other NOVA programs, including trainings, webinars, awareness campaigns, and survivor-centered outreach.

Qualified candidates should possess strong writing, communication, organizational, and creative skills, with the ability to manage multiple projects and collaborate in a professional environment. Experience or interest in communications, marketing, digital media, graphic design, public policy, nonprofit organizations, journalism, criminal justice, or related fields is encouraged. Strong Canva skills are required, including the ability to independently produce polished social media graphics, campaign materials, presentations, and branded visual content. Experience with short-form video editing, social media platforms, and digital storytelling tools is strongly preferred.

This opportunity is open to undergraduate and graduate students currently enrolled in an accredited degree program. This is a fully remote, unpaid internship for the 2026–2027 academic year; hours will be determined based on student availability and academic requirements.
