



NOVA Training and Technical Assistance MSW Intern 2026 - 2027

The National Organization for Victim Advocacy (NOVA) is a recognized leader in the victims' rights movement. Since 1975, NOVA has advocated for the advancement and enforcement of victims' rights; championed dignity and compassion for victims and survivors of crime; and promoted the professionalization of victim advocacy.

Serving under the direction of the Senior Director of Training and Technical Assistance (TTA) and the assigned NOVA TTA program manager, the NOVA TTA Intern will support national efforts to strengthen survivor-centered and trauma-informed responses for victims and survivors of crime. The TTA Intern will support the development and implementation efforts across one of NOVA's designated teams or initiatives.

Responsibilities may include assisting with the development of training materials and educational resources; supporting webinar and meeting coordination; organizing and synthesizing feedback on training or technical assistance; supporting multidisciplinary collaboration efforts; and contributing to project-related communications and materials. Interns may also assist with tracking project activities, compiling information for reports, and supporting outreach or engagement efforts related to national training and technical assistance initiatives.

Qualified students should possess strong communication, writing, organizational, and critical-thinking skills, as well as the ability to manage multiple projects and work collaboratively in a professional environment. Students should demonstrate an interest or experience in macro social work practice, victim advocacy, trauma-informed services, nonprofit organizations, training and education, or related fields. This opportunity is intended for Master of Social Work (MSW) students seeking hands-on experience in national training and technical assistance efforts, program development, and systems-informed victim services work.

This is a fully remote, unpaid internship, eligible to apply for course credit and/or Master of Social Work (MSW) field placement. Interns will have access to MSW supervision, ongoing professional education, NOVA membership, and NACP Advocate Credentialing. This internship will take place during the 2026 – 2027 academic year, hours to be determined based on student needs.
